





Conductors / Teachers

Dr. Mark Sholl has been the director of orchestras at Hilliard Davidson High School and Music Coordinator for the Hilliard City Schools for the past twenty-three years. His teaching involves directing the four orchestras at Hilliard Davidson. His music coordinator responsibilities include conducting three orchestras at Davidson High School and overseeing the music budget and staffing for 13 elementary schools, two 6th grade schools, three middle schools and three high schools. He is also the past President of the Ohio Orchestra and String Teachers Association. He currently



serves on the ProMusica Chamber Orchestra Board and is their Education Committee Chair. Dr. Sholl is the music director of the Columbus Symphony Cadet Orchestra, one of four levels of youth orchestras associated with the Columbus Symphony Orchestra. Prior to his tenure with the Hilliard Schools, he was the Orchestra and Assistant Band Director at Grove City High School for six years, where he won the National Sallie Mae Teaching Award. He also conducted numerous ensembles at Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp in Michigan. In 2011, he

received the Ohio Music Education Association Outstanding Music Teacher of the Year Award. In 2016, he received The Ohio State University's Loadman Award for his dissertation entitled: *Maintaining Administrative Support for Public School Fine Arts Programs in an Era of High Stakes Testing and Accountability*. Dr. Sholl is the current orchestra columnist for the OMEA Triad. He studied at The Peabody Conservatory of the Johns Hopkins University, Ferris State University, The University of Michigan, where he received his Bachelor of Music, and The Ohio State University where he received his Master of Arts and his Ph.D.

As Orchestra Director at Weaver Middle School and Assistant Director at Davidson High School, Virginia Faulkner is currently in her sixteenth year of teaching strings in the Hilliard City Schools. She teaches grades six through twelve in three different schools in the district. Previously, she taught for three years in the Delaware City Schools. She has served as the manager for the Columbus Symphony Cadet Orchestra and assistant for the Columbus Children's Community Orchestra. In addition, she has taught for the Worthington Chamber Music Connection and the Suzuki Music Center of Central Ohio. She was a director and counselor for the OOSTA Middle School Orchestra Camp. In 2012, Mrs. Faulkner won the OOSTA Public School Teacher of the Year award. In addition, she is past



Secretary of OOSTA. A violinist and pianist, Mrs. Faulkner has performed with the Central Ohio Symphony Orchestra and the West Virginia Symphony Orchestra. She has both her Bachelors and Masters degrees from The Ohio State University.

Guest Conductor

Conductor **Douglas Droste** is recognized as possessing "obvious joy" for making music and a "sure sense of timing" when on the podium. Those under his baton routinely acknowledge his in-depth interpretations, keen sense of communication, and personable ability to empower musicians. Droste is the Artistic Director of the Muncie Symphony Orchestra (MSO) and Director of Orchestras at Ball State University.



Droste has led dynamic performances with the MSO and has been praised for his innovative programming. He has conducted performances of Scott Routenberg's *Concerto for Jazz Violin and Orchestra* featuring Christian Howes; Michael Shapiro and Victor Cheng's *Identity: Zhongshang Zhuang, Concerto for Guzheng and Orchestra* featuring Su Chang; and recently commissioned Joe Deninzon's *Dream Diary: Concerto for Seven-String Electric Violin and Orchestra*. Droste has also led passionate performances of traditional repertoire such as Beethoven's *Symphony No. 9*, Debussy's *La Mer*, and Bartok's *Concerto for Orchestra*.

Believing that community engagement is critical for orchestras, Droste has helped establish new concerts such as the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Concert, a Sensory Friendly concert for children with special needs, a Toddler Pops concert, and co-created/produced the popular Young People's Concert, "Music is Science!" Droste continues to

program accessible pops concerts with artists such as *Time for Three*, the Ball State University "Pride of Mid-America" Marching Band, and local blues/gospel singer-songwriter, Jennie De Voe.

At Ball State, Droste conducts the Ball State Symphony Orchestra (BSSO) and oversees the orchestral conducting program. The BSSO performs a diverse mix of traditional repertoire and new music. Always seeking unique collaborations, the orchestra has performed a dual performance of the *Nutcracker Suites* by Tchaikovsky and Duke Ellington; the first live performance of Oliver Nelson's *The Kennedy Dream* since the original recording release in 1967 (both with the Ball State Jazz Ensemble); and the Langston Hughes Project: *Ask Your Mama: 12 Moods for Jazz* with jazz pedagogue, Ron McCurdy. The BSSO will perform at the 2016 Indiana Music Education Association Conference.

In 2014, Droste and jazz violinist Christian Howes were invited by the U.S. Embassy in Ukraine to perform and teach as part of an ongoing cultural exchange and engagement. Droste guest conducted the INSO-Lviv Symphony Orchestra in a goodwill concert entitled "Music from the New World" and gave a conducting masterclass to young Ukrainian conductors. Other recent guest conducting includes the orchestras of Columbus, Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Midland-Odessa, and the Amarillo Virtuosi, performing as violin/leader on Bach's Brandenburg Concerto No. 1. Demonstrating his versatility, Droste has conducted pops concerts with artists such as Ben Folds, The Flaming Lips, Pink Martini, Michael Cavanaugh, John Pizzarelli, and Emily Brennan.

A dedicated advocate of music education, Droste regularly conducts youth orchestras and presents in-service conference sessions throughout the country. He is active as a clinician and adjudicator for school orchestras and festivals, and is affiliated with organizations such as Yamaha, Music For All, American String Teachers Association, and Festival Disney.

A talented violinist, Droste has performed with the orchestras of Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Nashville, Memphis, Lubbock, and the Lancaster Festival (OH). He is a former student of John Gilbert and the late Michael Davis. Droste is also skilled on viola and trumpet, and has sung with a variety of choral ensembles.

Droste has held positions at Oklahoma State University, Oklahoma City Philharmonic, Oklahoma Youth Symphony, Austin Peay State University, and Liberty Union-Thurston School District (OH). Droste studied conducting at the Pierre Monteux School, the Oregon Bach Festival with Helmuth Rilling, as well as at other prominent conducting seminars. His primary conducting mentors include Gary Lewis, Larry Rachleff, and Michael Jinbo. Droste holds degrees from The Ohio State University and Texas Tech University.

Caitlin Barthoic is a 2003 graduate of Hilliard Davidson High School and a 2007 graduate of Bowling Green State University. She received her Masters Degree from Ohio State in 2013. While at Bowling Green, Miss Bartholic was a music

education major with a specialty in strings. She was a regular studio piano accompanist for several of the performance studios at BGSU. Her major instrument is the violin. She has studied violin with Dr. Robert Gillespie and Dr. Penny Kruse. Miss Bartholic's duties in the Hilliard City Schools includes directing the orchestra programs at Tharp Sixth Grade School and assisting at Weaver Middle School and Davidson high School with their top chamber orchestra.



Gillian Henning is a 2013 graduate of Otterbein University. A 2009 graduate of Reynoldsburg High School, her private teachers included Cora Kuyvenhoven. Miss Henning maintains a large private cello studio. Miss Henning's duties in the Hilliard City Schools includes working the

orchestra program at Tharp Sixth Grade School and assisting at Weaver Middle School, and Davidson High School with their youngest orchestra, the Concert Orchestra.

- Are abilities with which all people are born and which can be developed to higher levels.


Greetings to the members of the Ohio Music Educators Association 2017 Conference. We are proud to introduce


